They have all been a delight to work on and to create for our favourite touring venue in the UK. I really enjoy making work for this beautiful, intimate space and its warm and generous audiences.

We have had so much fun in rehearsals, trying out new ideas, working on music and laughing a lot. I'd like to think that lots of that joy has found its way into the show.

Snow White is a show about mothers and daughters and about growing up and growing old. It's also about boundaries and walls and the kind of world we want to live in. Every generation has to take ownership and responsibility for the world we share, even in a fairy tale. In this fairy tale, Snow White runs away from home and makes a new life in the forest. I thought a lot about who she might find living in that environment, about values, redemption and renewal. With that, you might say it's about social responsibility.

I hope you enjoy the world we have created for this show and the characters who live in it.



ALEX MURDOCH



ABAYOMI ONIYIDE






CAMBRIDGE JUNCTION
