JOB DESCRIPTION: ARTS ADMINISTRATOR

The Engagement Assistant will be a key staff member at Tobacco Factory Theatres, working within the Arts Team, which will consist of three further members of staff: Artistic Director (Mike Tweddle), Associate Director (Jay Zorenti-Nakhid) and Head of Artistic Engagement (Ailie Debonnaire). The Arts Team work collaboratively across the theatre's creative projects including programming, engagement, artist support and producing. The Engagement Assistant will work administratively and practically on a range of projects including Producer Training, Young Theatre Makers, Factory Singers, Acting Lab and Schools Take Over. Practical work on these programmes will at times include presence at and assistance of workshops, offering pastoral care for our workshop participants. The role also encompases support on our programming work and produced shows. The work will include regular team meetings and administrative help on projects at all stages, from planning, to delivery to evaluation. Much of the Arts Team's focus during this time will be in preparation for a piece of produced new writing, to play in Autumn 2022. A scheme of multi arts engagement work will support, precede and provide a legacy for this production, which The Engagement Assistant will be supporting.

SCOPE

We see this as an opportunity for someone to work closely with each member of the department, to be a member of a team where all voices are heard equally and each team member can have a genuine impact on the work we deliver, the people we engage with and the experiences we offer. The Engagement Assistant's key responsibilities will therefore be varied.

The Engagement Assistant will be line managed by the Head of Artistic Engagement and will work closely with the Artistic Director and Associate Director, to offer support across our programmes.

This is an entry level role, we are not expecting candidates to have specific experience in a similar role. The Engagement Assistant will be supported by all members of the Arts Team to develop skills in producing and programming, and delivering, and evaluating engagement work. As well as learning about the various elements involved in engaging



communities and producing participatory projects. Tobacco Factory Theatres is run by a small team, naturally there is a great deal of cross over between departments, therefore the Engagement Assistant will develop a broad understanding of the runnings of a theatre including, marketing, development/fundraising, and operational. You will also be supported to learn more about a future career in theatre, or arts and more generally to develop your CV to support your progression onto future roles within the sector.

As a key member of our team, the Engagement Assistant will be offered complimentary tickets to see shows produced and programmed by Tobacco Factory Theatres, in line with our staff comps policy.

As Engagement Assistant, you will:

- To support the coordination and delivery of outreach community workshops related to our produced show, as well as our core in- house engagement work.
- To conduct research and think creatively about the department's creative vision.
- To work with the department and feed in ideas to support the development of the artists, children and young people we work with.
- To create social media content for the department.
- To act as a practical assistant for our workshop delivery programme, this will include attending some of our in house rehearsals and occasional in School workshops.
- To support the Head of Artistic Engagement in the creation of resources and audio-digital content for schools and young people.
- To record statistics and evaluation materials for projects.

- Energy and enthusiasm and a passion for provoking change.
- An interest and passion for performance and arts.
- Candidates will need to be computer literate and should have the ability to prioritise and work under pressure with organisational skills.
